Psalm 105:14 He allowed no one to oppress them; for their sake he rebuked kings: 15 "Do not touch my anointed ones; do my prophets no harm."

What does it refer to for instance?

Genesis, Abraham, Isaak, Hoofdstuk 20 Abraham and Abimelek

Genesis 20: 3 But God came to Abimelek in a dream one night and said to him, "You are as good as dead because of the woman you have taken; she is a married woman."

Genesis 20: 6 Then God said to him in the dream, "Yes, I know you did this with a clear conscience, and so I have kept you from sinning against me. That is why I did not let you touch her.

So, what was this all about?

Not about spiritual leaders in the NT, or your pastor, or anybody, this was specific instant in the OT. This is God protecting His people.

And what about the prophets in verse 15?

Genesis 20: 7 Now return the man's wife, for he is a prophet, and he will pray for you and you will live. But if you do not return her, you may be sure that you and all who belong to you will die."

So are we free to say whatever we want to our leaders? No.

Hebrews 13:7 Remember your leaders, who spoke God's message to you; reflect on the outcome of their lives and imitate their faith.

Hebrews 13:17 Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they keep watch over your souls and will give an account for their work. Let them do this with joy and not with complaints, for this would be no advantage for you.

However, false teachers and teaching are being called out:

More than 100 bible verses that do warn us about false teachers in the church and more than 100 times they are called out in the bible. So if "we can not touch Gods abointed..." why do we see, more than 100 times in the bible that false teachers are called out? Yep. Matthew 7:15 Romans 16:17-18 2 Corinthians 11:13-15

2 Corinthians 11:13-15 For such men are false apostles, deceitful workmen, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. So it is no surprise if his servants, also, disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will correspond to their deeds.

Romans 16:17 I urge you, brothers and sisters, to watch out for those who cause divisions and put obstacles in your way that are contrary to the teaching you have learned. Keep away from them.

The false teachers are the ones who are causing divisions. Not the ones who call them out.

Scripture NEVER differentiates between anointed and unanointed Christians. Not one bible verse.

1 Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

1 John 20:2 But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and all of you know the truth.
